Description: What does it mean to write today? At a time of unprecedented expansion of the role of media in the lives of many of the people on the globe, who is it that

writes? For what audiences, and as a part of what communities, are texts produced? In which networks of meaning and of practice does writing play an important role? To what other practices, from stand up comedy and music

making to environmentalism and hacking, is writing connected?

In this course, we will explore what it means to talk of literature today, from works of literary and genre fiction, to journalistic reportage, to texts that radically blur the line between fact and fiction. We will explore some of the varieties of contemporary poetry, hip hop videos, comics, and the proliferation of new

writing forms on the internet (blogs, fan fiction, social media). While maintaining a firm focus on the problem of writing, and the specific powers and problems of the written word, we will develop ways of understanding and navigating the

complex and diverse worlds that literature is a part of today.
