AP/EN 3160 6.0A (Y) Literature of the Fantastic

Description: This course examines fantasy literature from the 18th century to the present day.

It provides an introduction to the history, conventions, and types of fantasy writing through a broad survey of notable examples of the genre, from Gulliver's Travels and The Castle of Otranto to A Game of Thrones and The Hunger Games. Students will learn about fantasy subgenres (e.g., gothic fantasy, portal fantasy, epic fantasy, dystopian fiction, science fiction, and children's fantasy), while exploring a range of critical approaches to the fantastic (including genre, readerresponse, postcolonial, and mythopoeic theories). Course topics include escapism; allegory and satire; realism; the uses of history and myth; quest narratives; heroism; gender; serialization, recycling, and adaptation; and the
