**Description:** This course is a study of children's literature during the twentieth century. Our

reading list includes a broad generic range of writing by, for, and about children, from Beatrix Potter to *Harry Potter*. While we hope that you enjoy the primary material, our approach is academic: we explore a variety of critical approaches to the works on our reading list, taking into account such issues as cultural context and audience. The delivery mode of this course is 2 hours of lecture + 1 hour of tutorial weekly (course materials are not on Moodle). Regular attendance in both *fora* is vital to success: unannounced quizzes and other on-the-spot assignments will be held in tutorials. Teaching team members are available in posted office hours during the term: students are encouraged to visit during these times for

assistance.

Students must stay abreast of all readings and should prepare for classes by

bringing relevant texts and materials with them.
