Description: This course examines the history, development, and craft of the personal essay.

It is conversational, intimate, and deeply subjective. It is beautifully suited to writing in the age of social media. Indeed, in this course, we will explore the relationship between blogging, and even extended Facebook posts or twitter essays, and the personal essay. In so doing, we will look at the history of this form and follow its

trajectory from the work of Montaigne to Manrepeller.
